Board of Commissioners

The Board of Commissioners is the governing board of the Troy Housing Authority. The Board establishes the strategic vision for the Troy Housing Authority and sets the policies the Troy Housing Authority staff will follow. These policies must be comply with the rules and regulations of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

Board members do not get involved in the day to day work being done by staff of the Troy Housing Authority. The daily operations of the Troy Housing Authority are done by staff members who report to the Executive Dir. The Board of Commissioners hold regular meetings every six weeks in accordance with the schedule posted at all sites and on the website of the Troy Housing Authority.

Griswold Heights Ribbon Cutting & Carnival

Griswold Heights was jumping during the Resident Carnival & Ribbon Cutting on July 10th 2025. Before we get to the bounce house jumping lets launch from the beginning.

The day started off with the Executive Director of the Troy Housing Authority, *Deb Witkowski* and partners for a ceremony located just outside the Griswold Heights Community Center under a huge white tent with seating for guests attending the ceremony.

John Larounis of MDG Construction started the ceremony by thanking Witkowski for her "determination and leadership" to be able to close on 2 projects within 9 months making way for a record breaking renovation project starting with Griswold Heights and continuing with a few more THA Properties in what is called Bundle 2. Larounis spoke from the heart stating "Deb powered this project with LOVE, she was instrumental in organizing and keeping the team on the same page. Larounis also thanked THA Maintenance for working in coordination with the construction teams to provide access and support. Larounis gave credit to Florence Ryan for attending every meeting and providing assistance as well as making sure staff were all in sync with operations and efficiency.

Mayor Carmella Mantello agreed that "collaborating as a partnership has given Griswold Heights and the Hills Heights Community a chance to be renewed and reimagined." Mayor Carmella continued "Its really great to see such improvement in this area, as the

daughter of a cop I am very familiar to this area and many other areas in the City of Troy. The renovations indoor and outdoors provides a much needed facelift to uplift the neighborhood."

John Mcdonald of the NYS Assembly voiced "Its quite remarkable to take something old and make it new". Larounis admits that bringing something from old and historic to life is not an easy task in

Griswold Heights Transformation & Timeline

June 22 2023

(New LED Lighting, New Flooring, Renovated Kitchens community. with New Appliances, New Bathrooms), Building System Upgrades, Exterior/Site Improvements of all units, buildings, roofs, sidewalks, landscaping, playgrounds, the Community Center and much more! Input, Comments and Questions from the residents of Griswold were received by members of MDG and THA Staff.

October 11 2023

The Troy Housing Authority (THA) along with our First Model development partner, MDG Real Estate Partners LLC (MDG), successfully closed on funding for the Griswold Heights revitalization project.

October 24 2023

Resident Meeting held at Griswold Heights Community MDG provided sample materials and a construction positions. schedule that previewed how renovations would be completed over a 24-month span. MDG introduced residents to staff liaisons brought on to assist MDG and THA with resident support. The staff liaisons between the May 2025 construction teams and residents, conducted individual needs assessments for each resident. The goal of the staff liaisons were to be in contact with construction teams and provide access to resident apartments in order for renovations to take place during business hours while residents remained in place. Input, Comments and Questions from the residents of Griswold were received by members of MDG and THA Staff.

November 2023

Troy Preservation Corp begins construction on Bundle 2







Bundle 2 - all of Bundle 2 renovations are actively underway!

The Troy Portfolio Preservation Bundle 2 Project is the formal name used for the revitalization of four (4) scattered sites containing a total of 341 affordable housing development apartments within the Troy Housing Authority's portfolio. They are located at:

CORLISS PARK

Includes: 4 - 1 Bedroom, 106 - 2 Bedroom, 36 - 3 Bedroom, and 38 - 4 Bedroom apartments. Within the site, 10 units are set aside as mobility accessible, and 4 units are designed as accommodation for the audio and visually impaired.

MARGARET PHELAN

Sweeney Exterior

Includes: 1 - Studio, 35 - 1 Bedroom, 17 - 2 Bedroom, 27 - 3 Bedroom, and 10 - 4 Bedroom apartments. Within the site, 5 units are set aside as mobility accessible, and 2 are designed as accommodation for the audio



Phelan ADA Bath

and visually impaired. CATHERINE SWEENEY

Includes: 2 - 1 Bedroom, 18 - 3 Bedroom, and 4 - 4 Bedroom apartments. Within the site, 2 units are set aside as mobility accessible, and 1 unit is designated as accommodation for the audio and visually impaired.

GRAND STREET

Includes: 3 - Studio, 23 - 1 Bedroom, 14 - 2 Bedroom, and 2 - 3 Bedroom apartments. Within the site, 3 units are mobility accessible, and 1 unit is designed as an accommodation for the audio-visually impaired.

The Troy Portfolio Preservation Bundle 2 revitalization project is a comprehensive scope of work and includes building system upgrades, in-unit renovations, and exterior improvements. In general and across all four sites as applicable, the improvements include building façade repairs,

new roofs, new windows, new

doors, new water distribution and sewer lines, new garbage enclosures, new energy efficient HVAC systems, new front and exterior LED lighting, fully renovated kitchens including new cabinets, stone countertops, stainless steel energy efficient appliances, new flooring, new bathrooms, living room ceiling fans, repaired sidewalks, enhanced landscaping, new lighting and camera security measures, new mailbox and bus shelter structures, outdoor amenities including playgrounds (where feasible), parking area repairs and much, much more.
